Expectations

- <u>Be Prepared</u>. Come to camp prepared with proper clothing, lunch & snacks, a pair of sneakers, change of clothes, bathing suit on appropriate days, and any medications needed.
- Respect. You must have respect for yourself and others. Never criticize other campers. Listen and cooperate when your counselor is speaking. Inappropriate behavior is not acceptable.
- <u>Hands off.</u> Unless participating in an activity that requires human touch, you are asked to not put your hands on other campers.
- <u>Play Fair</u>. Be a good sport and play fair. Represent yourself well. Use your words when needing to express a concern or difference of opinion. Choose your words carefully and thoughtfully.
- <u>Focus</u>. During Summer Camp you will be asked to participate in many different games & activities. Focus on following directions and rules to ensure a great camp experience.
- <u>Housekeeping</u>. You will be expected to help clean up! Take care of your environment. All trash should be disposed of properly. All camp property and items should be respected and taken care of.
